NM-EDSS is a web-based system used by public health staff throughout the state to track investigations of suspected, probable and confirmed cases of notifiable infectious diseases. Data for prior years are also subject to minor revisions due to corrections or identification of historical cases. 



Number of Reported Cases of Campylobacteriosis by Month






Number of Reported Cases of Pertussis by Month




Number of Reported Cases of Salmonellosis by Month


Number of Reported Cases of Shigellosis by Month
