

New Mexico Department of Health 2017 Weekly Infectious Disease Report Week 02 January 08, 2017 - January 14, 2017

This report is prepared by the Infectious Disease Epidemiology Bureau (IDEB) for notifiable infectious diseases reported through the New Mexico Electronic Disease Surveillance Systems (NM-EDSS). NM-EDSS is a web-based system used by public health staff throughout the state to track investigations of suspected, probable and confirmed cases of notifiable infectious diseases. Data for the current year are provisional and subject to change upon the completion of ongoing disease investigations. Data for prior years are also subject to minor revisions due to corrections or identification of historical cases. 
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
Number of Reported Cases of Campylobacteriosis by Month


Number of Reported Cases of Salmonellosis by Month




Number of Reported Cases of Giardiasis by Month




Number of Reported Cases of Shigellosis by Month
