New Mexico Pregnancy Risk Assessment (PRAMS) Multiyear Data Tables, Birth Years 1998-2003

PRAMS surveys new mothers within two to six months after delivery, asking about experiences, attitudes, and behaviors related to infant and maternal health. Data are used to help plan and evaluate programs, inform policymakers, and educate healthcare providers and the public.

In these tables, questions follow same order as the table of contents (introductory section) of the NM PRAMS Surveillance Report, Birth Years 2001-2002, which is available on line or in print from NM PRAMS. The Surveillance Report includes the public health importance of each topic, actions addressing the issues, and the methodology of the PRAMS project.

Topics include preconception health (folic acid, intention of pregnancy, family planning); maternal behaviors and experiences, (alcohol and tobacco use, infant's smoke exposure, physical abuse by a partner, maternal weight problem and diabetes); care during the prenatal and postpartum periods (timely prenatal care, topics discussed during prenatal care, payer of care, health-related services); infant care (breastfeeding, infant sleep position, well-child care); and food sufficiency.

The lower and upper limits of each confidence interval (95% CI) appear in the columns labeled "lower" and "upper," respectively. If the figure in the column, "±" is subtracted from or added to the "percent" figure, this gives the limits of the lower or upper 95% CI. When comparing estimates, if the 95% CI's do not overlap, we assume that there is a difference. However, if there is a small overlap, we need to do statistical tests to determine whether or not there is a difference.

Potential sources of bias include non-response, excluding non-resident and out-of-state births, and dropping Navajo women living on reservations from 2 months in 2002 and 5 months in 2003.
