

Adaptive Equipment & Assistive Technology »	Devices or services that increase, maintain or improve the functional capabilities of a child to improve independence in daily activities
Audiological Services »	Identifies auditory impairment in a child and provides auditory training, aural rehabilitation, speech, reading and listening device orientation and training
Family Education, Counseling & Home Visits »	Provided by qualified social workers, psychologists and other qualified personnel to assist the family in understanding the special needs of the child and enhancing the child's development
Health Services »	Health-related services (e.g., clean intermittent catheterization, tracheotomy care, tube feeding) that enable a child to benefit from the provision of other early intervention services
Medical Services for Diagnostic & Evaluation Purposes »	Provided by licensed physicians to determine a child's developmental status and other information related to the need for early intervention services
Nursing Services »	Services include the assessment of health status; nursing care to restore or improve functioning, and promote optimal health and development; and administration of medications, treatments and regimens prescribed by a physician
Nutrition Services »	Developing and monitoring appropriate plans to address the nutritional needs of eligible children, particularly around feeding skills and feeding problems
Occupational Therapy »	Activities designed to improve fine motor skills (finger, hand or arm movements) and oral-motor abilities (eating or swallowing)
Physical Therapy »	Activities designed to improve gross motor skills (leg, back or whole body movements)
Psychological Services »	Psychological counseling for children and parents or family counseling, and/or psychology assessment
Service Coordination »	Activities that enable the families of children to access and receive early intervention services
Social Work Service »	Coordination of community resources and services to enable the child and family to receive maximum benefits from early intervention services
Special Instruction »	Provides families with information, skills and support to enhance the child's development in all areas
Speech-Language Therapy »	Activities or materials designed to improve a child's ability to understand and express ideas and information
Transportation Services »	Supports the family with the cost of travel and other related costs that are necessary to enable the child and family to receive early intervention services
Vision Services »	Addresses visual functioning in order to enable the child to more fully participate in family and community activities

Individuals providing early intervention services must hold a professional license or certificate from an appropriate field.
