## Resources for OT Assessment for Adults with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities (I/DD)

**OT Assessment/Evaluation should be guided by "The OT Practice Framework"** available through the American OT Association (AOTA).

Areas to focus on in assessment/evaluation should be guided by the "Occupational Profile" and the areas of occupation that the individual and the IDT want to focus on. With adults with I/DD this would be guided by the ISP Vision/Outcomes as well as areas affecting client health, safety and function. This should be combined with looking at the contexts of occupation – IE: Environmental Evaluation and other life contexts.

There are some Assessment Tools that OT's have found to be particularly helpful with this population (this list is not meant to be inclusive):

The **Canadian Occupational Performance Measure** (COPM). Designed to be used with clients with a variety of disabilities and across all developmental stages. It is designed to be used as an outcome measure. This is a Standardized Tool. <a href="https://www.caot.ca">www.caot.ca</a>

The **Jacobs Inventory of Functional Skills** (JIFS). An assessment tool and treatment guide designed for the Developmentally Delayed population of older children and adults. Consists of a fairly comprehensive Life Skills Section that covers Self-Help, Home Management, Work Readiness/Cognition, and Community Tasks. The Foundation Skills section covers: Sensory Integration, Neuromotor Status, Fine Motor Skills and Oral Motor Skills. <a href="www.betterfunctioning.com">www.betterfunctioning.com</a>

The **Sensory Integration Inventory** – **Revised, for Individuals with Developmental Disabilities**. Designed as a Screening Tool for individuals who may benefit from Treatment for Sensory Dysfunction. Describes behaviors and responses to everyday activities which may be indicators of Sensory Dysfunction. <a href="https://www.pdppro.com">www.pdppro.com</a>

The **Adolescent/Adult Sensory Profile** (Brown and Dunn). "Provides a standard method for professionals and individuals to measure and to profile the effect of sensory processing on functional performance." Most appropriate for individuals aged 11-65+. www.SensoryProfile.com

Goal Attainment Scaling is a mathematical technique for measuring achievement of treatment goals/objectives. It can be used with a large variety of individuals. Goal Attainment Scaling produces a Goal Attainment Score (GAS) which allows you to track progress of individual goals or collective goals. The GAS can be converted into a standard T score. It has been utilized in OT and rehabilitation research. This concept is easy to apply and has great potential for outcomes research with Adults with I/DD.
