WHEREAS, the health and well-being of our citizens are of the utmost importance to our great state; and

WHEREAS, rural communities often face accessibility issues, healthcare provider shortages, transportation barriers, aging population suffering from a greater number of chronic conditions, and larger percentages of un- and underinsured citizens; and

WHEREAS, rural communities are resilient, resourceful, innovative, and collaborative, when addressing local challenges with creative solutions; and

WHEREAS, rural America is a great place for dedicated health professionals to deliver essential health services and provide comprehensive, individualized care; and

WHEREAS, National Rural Health Day, founded by the National Organization of State Offices of Rural Health (NOSORH) and celebrated annually on the third Thursday of November; and

WHEREAS, this serves as a reminder of the unique needs and opportunities that rural communities face in accessing quality healthcare services.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Michelle Lujan Grisham, Governor of the State of New Mexico, do hereby proclaim November 21, 2024, as:
