


New Mexico has the


WHAT IS NALOXONE?

PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION USED TO REVERSE THE EFFECTS
OF AN OPIOID (PRESCRIBED OR NOT) OVERDOSE.
IT IS EASY TO ADMINISTER AND SAFE TO USE

NALOXONE, also known as NARCAN, has been used for decades by emergency responders and in hospital settings.



GOT NALOXONE?



In New Mexico, DOH has been distributing naloxone SINCE 2001 through its HARM REDUCTION PROGRAMS

In 2016, legislation enacted permitting the possession, storage, distribution, prescribing, and administration of naloxone

HOW TO INCREASE AVAILABILITY?



·· Require private insurers to pay for naloxone.



Increase prescription of naloxone by licensed prescribers with any opioid prescription.



Expand stocking and distributing naloxone to all outpatient pharmacies.



Increase education on naloxone use and application and where to obtain it.
