



INTERAGENCY COORDINATING COUNCIL (ICC) November 2016 Meeting Highlights

- ❖ Voted to select Kathey Phoenix-Doyle and Samantha Yancey as ICC Co-Chairs Elect.
- ❖ Voted to continue having Sophie Bertrand participate on the ICC Executive Committee.
- ❖ Voted to approve the 2017 Committee Action Plans which together comprise the ICC 2016-2018 Strategic Plan.
- ❖ Voted to approve the ICC Quality Committee's assessment recommendations for consideration by the FIT Program.
- ❖ Recognized Cathy Stevenson for her years of service on behalf of children with or at risk for developmental delay and adults with developmental disabilities and their families.
- ❖ Discussed the results of the 2016 Family Satisfaction Survey.
- ❖ Learned about and discussed the projects and timelines for Race to the Top/FIT FOCUS and voted to endorse the FIT Program in moving forward with the FIT FOCUS Pilot Projects and in piloting the FIT FOCUS document.
- ❖ Voted to approve the edits to the ICC Bylaws.
- ❖ Voted to approve the 2017 ICC public meeting dates and locations.
- ❖ Recommended the following changes to the FIT Lead Agency Report: data for each data field in the report to be run at the same time so figures in different sections of the report are not impacted by when the data for each section was run; obtain tribal affiliations from Census data and compare to tribal affiliations in FIT KIDS; break out children transitioning from FIT KIDS exit data; have the FIT KIDS Data Group consider recommending turning off the data field for children eligible for Part B but receiving FIT services.
- ❖ Recommended that the FIT Program develop a list of tribal contacts and disseminate the list to FIT agencies.
- ❖ Recommended that the FIT Program take the lead in identifying a forum for meeting with tribes and pueblos to discuss family service needs and options.
- ❖ Recommended that the FIT Program provide the ICC with the way in which FIT Frequently Asked Questions are to be addressed and disseminated.
- ❖ Learned about the programs and services provided by the Center for Development and Disability (CDD).
