Power of Attorney (POA)

Powers of Attorney are legal notarized documents allowing a person or entity to act as a decision maker for another individual. The decision maker may be chosen by a participant to make medical or financial decisions. The participant must have the ability to choose a decision maker before the creation of a POA.

What types of POA's are available?

Durable Power of Attorney – is a legal document where the participant chooses a decision maker if the participant becomes disabled or incapacitated to manage and protect:

- Money
- Property
- Business affairs

Financial Power of Attorney – is a legal document in which a participant chooses a decision maker to make financial decisions on the participants behalf.

Limited (Special) Power of Attorney – is a legal document that gives the decision maker the power to act on the participants behalf for specific purposes. The decision maker ability

ends after their purpose has been finished or after a specific time period.

Medical Power of Attorney – is a legal document that gives a decision maker the ability to communicate with the participant's health care providers and make health care decisions on behalf of the participant if the participant becomes incapacitated.

Springing Power of Attorney – means a legal document that gives the decision maker the ability to manage the participant's money, property, and business affairs. This document will go into effect if an accident or medical condition results in the participant becoming incapacitated.

How long does a POA serve a participant?

A participant can cancel a POA at any time.

They may also choose a new POA at any time and cancel a previous POA.

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Service Highlights:

Transportation Services

Transportation services are offered to enable participants to be more independent and be involved in their community. Transportation services specified by the service and support plan (SSP) are offered to allow participants to have access to:

- Waiver and other community services
- Activities
- Resources

Payments for transportation services are paid to the employee or vendor. They cannot be paid to the participant. Transportation services can be reimbursed in different ways to the driver:

- By the mile.
- By the trip or at an hourly rate.
- Purchase of a bus pass.

Transportation services under Mi Via are for non-medical reasons. Mi Via transportation services cannot be used instead of or to replace transportation services available with Medicaid. Transportation for vacations are not covered through Mi Via. Transportation service for minors is not a covered service as these are services that a legally responsible individual (LRI) would normally provide for household members of the same age who do not have a disability or chronic illness.

Environmental Modifications Service (EMOD)

EMOD services include the purchase and installation of equipment or making physical adaptations to the eligible participants residence that are necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the participant or improve the participants level of independence. EMOD services to not cover modifications or adaptations that would be considered normal upkeep of a residences.

The provider of the EMOD services must:

- Ensure correct design standards are addressed when planning and designing the adaptation or remodel.
- Must be a licensed and insured contractor or
- Must be an approved vendor that provides construction or remodeling services.

These services are available for a maximum of \$5000 every 5 years. An eligible participant moving into the Mi Via program from another waiver will carry their EMOD history for the previous five years of Home and Community Based Services (HCBS).

Some examples of environmental adaptations include the following:

- Installation of ramps and grab bars.
- Widening of doorways and hallways.

• Installation of automatic door openers and doorbells, etc.

EMOD services do not cover home improvements that would be considered normal upkeep of a residences such as but not limited to:

- Rain gutters
- Tile replacement
- Mold repair
- Sagging floors
- New faucets
