**ADDENDUM NO. 1**

To whom it may concern,

This Addendum is issued to address several questions we have received regarding the response requirements for the Request for Information “**Pharmaceutical and Medical Supply Distribution Software**”. We understand that there may be some confusion about the scope of your responses, and we hope the following clarifications will assist in preparing your submissions.

Question No. 1:	S2K Pharma uses LS Pedia for our integrated DSCSA (EPCIS) and VRS services. My understanding is that you have a relationship with Inmar for this? Are you willing to change to LSP?
Answer No. 1	Firstly, I misspoke on the call. Our current solution for DSCSA compliance is provided through Tracelink (a subcontractor of Pharmedlink). Our primary priority is finding a pharmaceutical ERP software. We understand that multiple pharmaceutical ERP vendors require a specific DSCSA solution (such as LS Pedia). Upon selection of a vendor for pharmaceutical ERP, we can work on procurement of a compatible DSCSA provider.
Question No. 2:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>For the two requirements below, we would require a VPN connection for anyone OUTSIDE of the office network before they can connect (via browser) for the software. This is for security purposes and not negotiable</li> </ul>

	<p>for our cloud environment. Is this acceptable?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I. All user interfaces must be accessible via an Internet browser, and not require any software to be installed on a client workstation or device except for browser software and drivers required to and similar input/ output (I/O) devices.</li> <li>II. The solution must allow direct access to the database(s) by State employees who possess the proper access rights. These employees must be able to choose from a variety of analytical / query tools (e.g. SAS, SQL Server Management Studio, etc.)</li> </ul>
<p>Answer No. 2</p>	<p>We can establish one so long as the company is domestically based and is ISO 27001, SOC-2 or NIST CSF2 compliant, and a certificate of compliance can be provided.</p>
<p>Question No. 3:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Do we answer questions 1-15 in the document? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Do I need to respond to any of the “Requirements” listed in the tables above these questions?</li> <li>b. The questions that are listed in the document titled “PHD Distribution Software Nov2024 RFI” seem to be more for a consultant on how to create the RFI and not about our company and software. Are we expected to complete those questions as well?</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<p>Answer No. 3</p>	<p>Vendors are not required to respond to every single question within the document. Vendors should focus on answering those questions that are relevant to their company and the</p>

	<p>services or software they offer. If a question pertains to the capabilities or services provided by the vendor, they should respond accordingly. It is not necessary to answer all the questions within the RFI document- only those that align with the vendors' offerings.</p>
Question No. 4:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What is the budget for this requirement?</li> </ul>
Answer No. 4	<p>We are currently in the process of gathering information to develop the Scope of Work, and as such, a specific budget has not been determined at this time.</p>
Question No. 5:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If this RFI greenlights a solicitation, what would the anticipated procurement timeline look like?</li> </ul>
Answer No. 5	<p>Currently, we are unable to provide a definitive procurement timeline. However, if this RFI leads to a solicitation, recommended sources will be notified accordingly.</p>
